Join us for a special opportunity to tour one of the newest museums in DC. The Capital Jewish Museum just opened to the public on June 9, 2023. The museum's collection is composed of historic artifacts, personal and family papers, as well as archival documents & photographs that trace the Jewish community in Washington DC, suburban Maryland, and Northern Virginia from the 1850s to the present day. It is a collection which reflects a history that is at once local, national, and international.

Bill Plante Conversations: "Come Walk in My Shoes"
February 27-Film Screening at 5 pm
Discussion with Robin Smith at 6:15 pm

The second of our Bill Plante Conversations will take place on February 27, when we will screen Robin Smith's documentary "Come Walk in My Shoes". This film is the story of Congressman John Lewis's compelling life story. The documentary provides a fresh, first-person perspective on the nonviolent protests that challenged segregation laws in the south and led to the passage of the Voting Rights Act in 1965.

Viewers travel with Congressman Lewis to places he calls "sacred sites of the Civil Rights Movement": the churches, parks and bridges where young people played a pivotal role in the struggle for equality and voting rights.

Robin, an Emmy Award-winning producer, had originally set out to do a profile of "The Faith & Politics Institute but was so moved by John Lewis and the others that she felt that had to be shared. "Viewers will see a very young John Lewis and what he did", "I want today's young people to look at that history and say, "I can do that: I can take a stand; I can be a part of something important", stated Robin.
